2012 NAVC Passport Program Prize Giveaway Contest **official rules**

1. The Contest Entry Periods

The Passport Program Contest (the "PP Contest") is open between 9:00 AM ET on Sunday, January 15, 2012 and 11:00 AM ET on Wednesday, January 18, 2012 (the "PP Contest Entry Period") and is sponsored by the NAVC Conference ("Sponsor") and 24 Passport Program sponsors ("PP Exhibitors"). The Daily Prize Giveaway Contest ("DPG Contest") is open between 9:15 AM ET on Sunday, January 15, 2012 and 9:55 AM ET on Wednesday, January 18, 2012, accepting contest entries each day between 9:15 – 9:55 AM only (the "DPG Contest Entry Period").

Eligibility

Eligibility to participate in these contests is limited to those veterinarians, veterinary technicians, veterinary students, veterinary technician students, receptionists and practice managers who have paid for their NAVC Conference 2012 registration. The following are not eligible to participate in these contests: speakers; VIPs; moderators; NAVC institute 2011 attendees who received complimentary registration; exhibitors; employees of sponsors or exhibitors, their parent, affiliates, subsidiarles, and advertising and promotion agencies, their immediate family members and persons living in the same household as said employees. Limit one (1) PP Contest entry and four DPG Contest entries, one (1) per day, per eligible NAVC Conference 2012 registrant as defined above. To be eligible to win the PP Contest, a registrant must visit and have his/her paper Passport stamped in at least 6 of the 10 sponsoring booths in the Orlando World Center Marriott Exhibit Hall AND 6 of the 14 sponsoring booths in the Gaylord Palms Exhibit Hall. Each person can only win once and he/she must receive stamps from at least 12 of the approved booths to qualify. Records will not be cleared after the daily drawings, nor will they be cleared at the end of each day. Once attendees visit and have their Passports stamped at 12 of the 24 booths in a qualifying combination, they are eligible for every drawing until they win or the PP Contest Entry Period expires.
